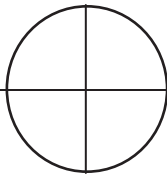

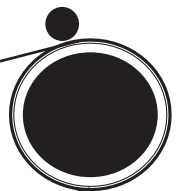



Range Rules

1. Shooting hours are: Weekdays 7:30 a.m. to Sunset; Weekends 8:00 am to Sunset.
2. Absolutely no alcoholic beverages allowed on the range property.
3. Range Officer - All shooting must be done under the supervision of a Certified Weld County Fish & Wildlife Range Officer. All actions will be the responsibility of the Range Officer.
4. Treat all firearms as if they are loaded. Keep the muzzle pointed in a safe direction at all times.
5. All barrels should be checked for obstructions before firing.
6. Actions of uncased firearms should be kept open except when on the firing line, ready to fire. Loaded firearms may not be removed from the firing line or other designated firing areas.
7. All firearms will be unloaded immediately upon the command "cease fire" regardless of when the command is given.
8. All inexperienced shooters should be accompanied by an experienced shooter, and anyone under 18 must be accompanied by an adult member.
9. Loud and abusive language will not be permitted. Shooter and range personnel will limit their conversation directly behind the firing line to official business.
10. All shooters, when done shooting, WILL clean up the range area of all targets, materials and trash. Use trash receptacles.
11. Destroying or damaging club property will be grounds for immediate dismissal from the club.
12. No shooting Wildlife on the range property.
13. No rifle or pistol shooting allowed east of the east berm of Range number 8 or west of the west berm of Range number 1. No firearms allowed on the Archery Range.
14. Shot type loads shall only be used on range 4 Members must provide a removable target. All targets, empty hulls and/or debris must be removed when member is finished.
15. Range Officers and members of WCFW may establish a firing line forward of benches when all present are in agreement. There SHALL NOT be any loading or unloading of firearms behind the established firing line.
16. All vehicles must stay on the roads and designated parking areas.
17. Gate must be kept closed except during organized events. During those events, the signs of designating the event must be hung on the range entrance sign.
18. Targets; **THE ONLY** objects that may be shot at on the range property are removable targets furnished by you or designated targets furnished for the club. **GLASS TARGETS ARE FORBIDDEN.** Only targets that do not cause ricochets are acceptable. Plinking targets are to be placed on the rail on the 100 yd. Range or hung. No targets will be placed or shot from the ground. **NO GROUND TARGETS.**
19. All dogs shall be kept on a leash except when in vehicles.
20. Eye and ear protection required at all times on or near the firing line.

On the Lighter Side

CLUNKER MATH

The person who calculated this bit of information is now and has been a professor at The University of West Virginia in Morgantown, West Virginia for the last forty some years.

A clunker that travels 12,000 miles a year at 15 mpg uses 800 gallons of gas a year.

A vehicle that travels 12,000 miles a year at 25 mpg uses 480 gallons of gas a year.

So, the average Cash for Clunkers transaction will reduce gasoline consumption by 320 gallons per year.

The government claims 700,000 clunkers have been replaced so that's 224 million gallons saved per year.

That equates to a bit over 5 million barrels of oil.

5 million barrels is about 5 hours worth of US consumption.

More importantly, 5 million barrels of oil at \$70 per barrel costs about \$350 million dollars.

So, the government paid \$3 billion of our tax dollars to save \$350 million.

We spent \$8.57 for every \$1.00 we saved.

I'm pretty sure they will do a better job with our health care, though.
